the lights, lit the candles, and put on the Barry White CD.

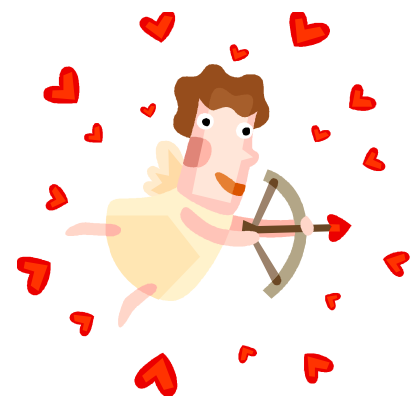
Start the day romantically.

Borrow a book on massage for beginners from the library, then armed with a small bottle of baby oil, you're certain to have a memorable evening.

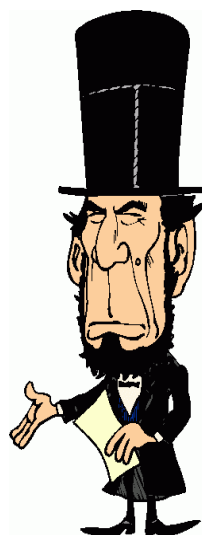


IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM THE MAIN

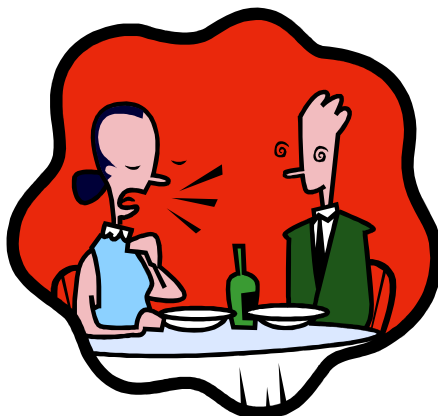

Your timing is perfect for finding these opportunities! You can work close to home and contribute to your community at the same time. Here are some ideas to get you started!

1. **Resident Assistants**—are USA staff hired to welcome new residents, communicate and enforce policy within the court, and provide regular community building activities. Applications for select courts will be

available in the Main Office in mid-March. Rent reductions vary per court.

2. **Resident Council**—is the official resident government elected by the residents to organize social and educational event, improve facilities, and represent the concerns of resident to administration. The election process starts in March, so get your campaign ready! Rent reductions for the one year term.

3. **Community Safety Patrol**—is a group of night owls who patrol the village at night to serve as the “eyes and ears” of the village. Since this program started in 2001, the crime rate in the village has been reduced. Positions available throughout the year and compensated with rent reduction.

4. **Part-time Maintenance**—are residents hired by maintenance to work as dispatchers, apartment cleaners, and grounds crew. They are hired as University staff and paid an

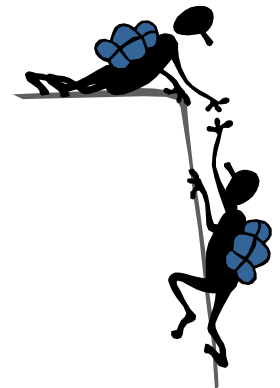
hourly rate. Part-time positions available throughout the year. Check www.apartments.utah.edu for job listings and an application.
