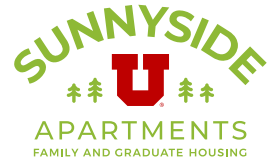


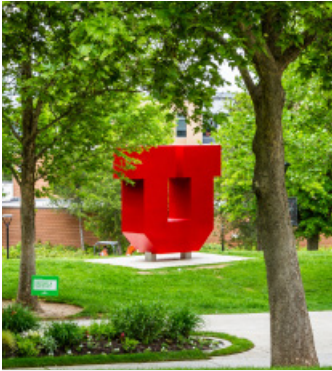

POLICY ANNOUNCEMENTS

As part of our effort to maintain a comfortable and safe living environment for everyone, we would like to highlight some policies from the Resident Handbook:

Repairs and Alterations

No Plumbing Alterations: Residents are not allowed to alter any part of the plumbing system in the apartment, including but not limited to toilets and faucets.

Window Safety Stops (Cottonwood and Spruce buildings): the window safety stops, which prevent windows from opening wider than 4 inches, must not be removed or tampered with. These stops are installed for your safety and the safety of others. Removing them can pose significant safety risks.

Stay hydrated. Carry a reusable water bottle and drink plenty of cool liquids, especially water, before you feel thirsty to prevent dehydration.

Tropical Soda Bar

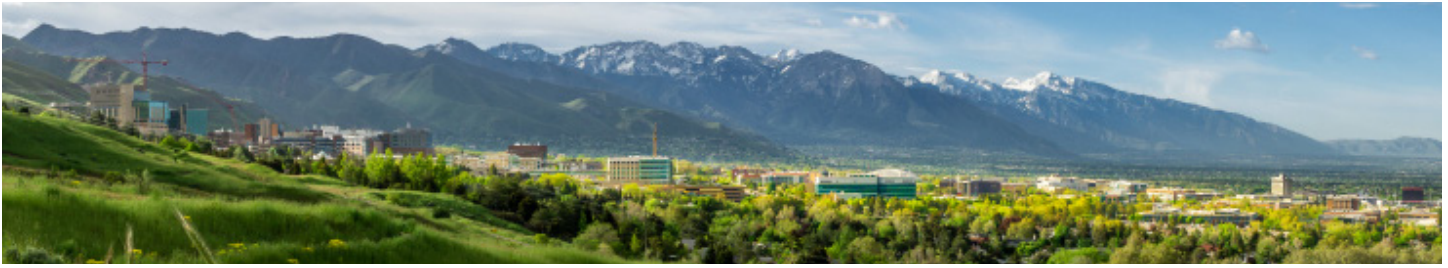

CONSTRUCTION UPDATES



As you may have noticed, the new buildings are taking shape. The brickwork on the eastern section of the graduate student building is complete and the siding is going up. As the work continues on the graduate building, the family building has begun to see wall panels going up! With roughly 250 workers, 25 pieces of heavy equipment (trackhoes, loaders, forklifts, haul trucks), and 3 cranes on-site each day, we are seeing rapid progress!
